VISIT BY DAVID DAVIS MP



RELIGIOUS STUDIES

Diwali Workshop

MATHS

Since September in Sparx maths, our Year 7 to 10 students have ...

... completed 5,658 hours of personalised maths learning!

... answered 205,452 questions correctly!

... earned nearly 1000 housepoints for Sparx maths alone!

The proportion of Year 7 to 10 students completing their maths homework has risen from below 90% to above 97% since the introduction of Sparx maths at Easter this year; the impact on outcomes for these students will be huge. Our SEND students in particular have said how much they like Sparx maths, and how it has improved their homework experience. A special shout-out goes to the following students who have earned the most XP (Sparx points) over the course of this term:

ENGLISH

Year 9 students have been preparing for the festive season by studying the Dickens classic 'A Christmas Carol'. As well as learning about how Ebeneezer Scrooge is taught humility and the Christmas spirit through the visitations of a variety of ghosts, students have learned about the social conditions in the Victorian period and how they encouraged Dickens to write political novels.

Their work culminated in an essay about how Dickens presents poverty throughout the novel and it is clear from their planning that students enjoyed the novel, produced high quality work and demonstrated an ability to plan and write detailed essays about literary texts.



CURRICULUM

JAPANESE



Many Japanese students have started working on a new group project on Thursdays. They are working towards a national contest for schools called "JaLaChamp: Japanese Language Championship 2024". They are tasked with creating original video clips in Japanese on given themes of "our talent" (KS4) and "what we want to save for the future"(KS5).

Four KS4 groups and one KS5 group were formed and, after allocating roles within groups, considered "what message do we want to convey and how?" as their first step. They have now sorted their story boards and translated dialogues, and are just about start recording with camcorders. Mr Dowsland and Mr Paffley (from The Consortium Academy Trust) are generously assisting the IT side of this project. 


novel (and Netflix film) following the interactions of three couples during a Christmas Eve snowstorm.

CAREERS

The Real Game - Year 8

On the 14 November we held The Real Game Enrichment Day for our Year 8 students. They took part in a range of activities throughout the day which included:

- Budgeting Students had to budget a lifestyle to fit the income from the job role they were given
- Smashing the Stereotypes The aim of the session was for students to understand what stereotyping is and challenge ideas which may have already formed.
- Labour Market Information This session gave the Year 8's insight to the different industry sectors and what is happening in these sectors in the Humber region.
- Unifrog The students were introduced to this careers platform. After taking the personality quiz they had the opportunity to research suggested careers
- Careers Speed-networking The Year 8's were given the opportunity to network with a variety of people from different industry sectors to gain insight to their job role and career journey. Some of the companies involved were NHS, GW Power, Swift Group, Police, Hobson & Porter, Northern Gas Networks, HETA, Hull College, Transwaste, ERYC Early Year Development.

Work Experience

Year 10: The Year 10 assembly on 16 November launched the work experience programme for this year. All Year 10 students will be doing one week of work experience in the summer term. We like to encourage students to find their own placement as this guarantees they are placed with a company that they are truly interested in. Students have until 18 March to secure there own placement using the self-found form. For students who don't manage to find their own placement there will be an option for them to apply for a placement from the school allocation.

Year 12: Work experience for Year 12 was launched this week. They will be completing their work experience week commencing 15 July. Again, students will be expected to source their own placement, but support will be available. Administration of the placements will be managed through the students Unifrog account. The East Riding Apprenticeship Event

On 15 November we were lucky enough to be visited by Paul Deighton who has created the iconic guitar for the stage show 'Turn and Face the Strange – the story of Mick Ronson'. The show is described as 'A stunning multi-media show with a powerful rock band, string quartet, film and live storytelling, that chronicles the life of Mick Ronson.

It tells the story of local Hull musician Michael 'Mick' Ronson, who, from humble origins as a gardener in East Hull, went on to play a major role in producing some of the most iconic music of the twentieth century, both as a sideman lead guitarist in the band 'The Spiders from Mars' and as a producer and arranger for David Bowie, Lou Reed, Ian Hunter and countless others.
