Actions:

- Provide high-quality staff training on equality, diversity, and inclusion to support best practices in teaching and student support.
- Strengthen pastoral care and mental health support to meet the diverse needs of our school community.

3. Respect - Promoting Positive Relationships and Tackling Discrimination

We will promote respect and understanding among all members of the school community, taking proactive steps to prevent and address discrimination, harassment, and bullying.

Actions:

- Implement a clear and robust system for reporting and addressing incidents of discrimination, harassment, and bullying.
- Deliver regular assemblies, workshops, and activities that promote respect, tolerance, and positive relationships.
- Engage with parents, carers, and the wider community to reinforce our commitment to equality and respect beyond the school gates.
