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1. Introduction

This policy statement sets out the academy's arrangements for managing the access of providers to young people at the academy for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the academy's legal obligations under section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

Learner entitlement

Young people in Years 8 – 13 are entitled:

- To find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships through options evenings, assemblies and groups discussions and taster events.
- To understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

Providers will need to arrange to meet with a representative from the Senior Leadership Team and

the Careers Leader to discuss the aims of the required access to enable the selection of an appropriate event that gives access to a particular groups.
