What are students learning during Autumn Term II?

English

19th Century Novella and Descriptive Writing (Continued) - Study 'A Christmas Carol'. Context of industrialised Britain - poverty and inequality. Focus on settings and characterisation, conventions of the Gothic. Descriptive writing skills.

Maths

Indices and standard form; Expression and formulae; Dealing with data; Multiplicative reasoning (Continued) - Using index laws to simplify expressions; substituting into formulae and solving equations to find unknown values; designing and using data collections sheets, tables and questionnaires; solving problems using inverse proportion.

Science

(Continued)

- 1. Cells and communicable diseases (Biology) Cells, microscopy, causes of, and defence against disease, antibiotics.
- 2. Atomic structure and the periodic table (Chemistry) Atoms, elements, mixtures, compounds
- 3. Energy I and particles (Physics) *Energy resources, energy related calculations, particle model, pressure.*

History

The USA Boom and Bust 1918 - 1939 - Capitalism and American democracy, the economic boom in the 1920s, prohibition, the Wall Street Crash 1929, The Great Depression

Geography

The Tropics - The Great Barrier Reef, Borneo and endangered animals, the Citarum River, The Maldives, Bolivia, Somali pirates, India, Jamaica tourism, Middle East, cruise ships

Religious Studies

Does religion have a future? (Continued) - Gender roles as portrayed within Christianity and Islam, Christian beliefs about sexuality, religious and conflict, reconciliation, inter-faith groups

French

Bien dans sa peau (Feel good about yourself) - Learning the parts of the body and sport, talking about healthy eating, making plans to get fit, describing levels of fitness, learning about French sportsmen and women

Spanish

Orientate (Places of work) - Describing jobs, characteristics which make you employable, places of work, tasks and responsibilities at work, describing a typical working day

Art

'Eat and Feel' - Gothic (Continued) - The Gothic movement - art, architecture and literature, identifiable features, Bram Stoker's Dracula, artist Ian Murphy and mixed media artwork.

Music

Back in Time 2 – Romantic Music - The intention of the Romantic composer, the invention of the piano, Mozart to Beethoven, musical instruments, thoughts, feelings and emotions, timbre, dynamics and tempo

Drama

Devising: The Dramatic Elements - Gothic Horror (Continued) - *Communicate and control dramatic elements within realism performance*

Physical Education - Girls

Games - Netball OR Hockey - Practice of core techniques and skills, rules and decision making

PE - Badminton, Fitness OR Dance - *Performance of movement in isolation, developing sequence*.

Physical Education - Boys

Games -Rugby OR Football; *Practice of core techniques and skills, rules and decision making* PE - Badminton OR Fitness - *Performance of movement in isolation, developing sequence*.

E-Safety & EasyGUI Programming (Continued) - Social engineering, sensitive information, permanency, social media. Variables, input, selection and buttonboxes. The students will also be creating a programming project which will span a number of lessons.
