Student home testing

As you will be aware following our in-school LFD testing, students are now able to conduct their own test at home. Students participating should conduct an LFD test twice per week – we suggest a Sunday evening/ Monday morning and a Wednesday evening or Thursday morning to provide the recommended 3-5 day gap between tests.

What to do with results?

All results should be reported to the Gov.uk website or via the NHS app.

The following notifications should also be sent to school:

- Negative result – no notification to school required
- Void result – notify school by emailing notifyus@wolfreton.co.uk so we can ensure a replacement test kit is issued
- Positive result – notify school immediately by emailing notifyus@wolfreton.co.uk so we can start the test and trace process

Testing over Easter

Students should continue testing twice-weekly throughout the Easter holidays. We also advise that those participating ensure a test is carried out prior to their return to school after Easter. Over the holiday period, in the event that your child tests positive for Coronavirus we do ask you to inform us through the NotifyUs email however, it is also important that you inform NHS Track and Trace of the result. Arrangements for schools are a little different over the break, and with the exception of any individuals who have been specifically invited on site, NHS Track and Trace will follow up contacts. On request, the school will of course provide them with the contact details of any young people who your child has been in class with for the 48 hours preceding the test or preceding the onset of symptoms, whichever is first. For all those participating in home testing, your child should have now brought home their home test kits. We ask that you support them to complete these tests, including one on the Sunday before we return.

Test kits supplies

Students who have been in school this week will have received a further pack of test kits from their form tutor. If a student was absent or didn't receive them then they can collect a test kit pack from main reception at the end of the school day.

Parents/carers are also welcome to come to the main school reception to collect a test kit pack for any students who are currently self-isolating. The school reception is over the Easter holidays between 8.15am and 3.30pm should students/parents need to collect further test kits.



Men in Sheds

The Art department was approached by the Men in Sheds Haltemprice charity to see if we would be interested in helping them design an outdoor junk sculpture for their new site in Haltemprice. The Charity is part of the Men's Sheds Association, the support body for Men's Sheds across the UK. They raise awareness of Men's Sheds and the life changing impact they can have. They're community spaces for men to connect, converse and create. The activities are often similar to those of garden sheds, but for groups of men to enjoy together. They help reduce loneliness and isolation, but most importantly, they're fun.

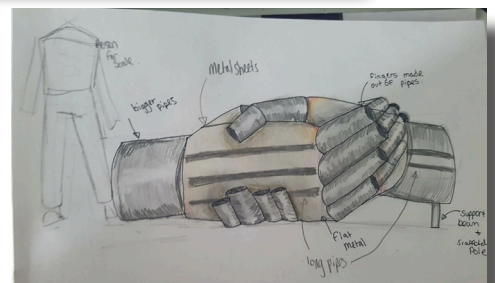
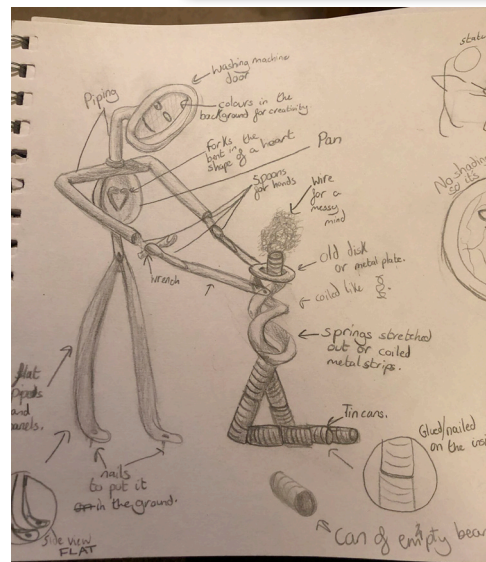
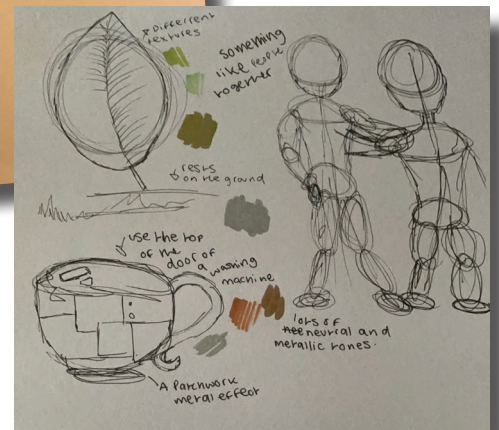
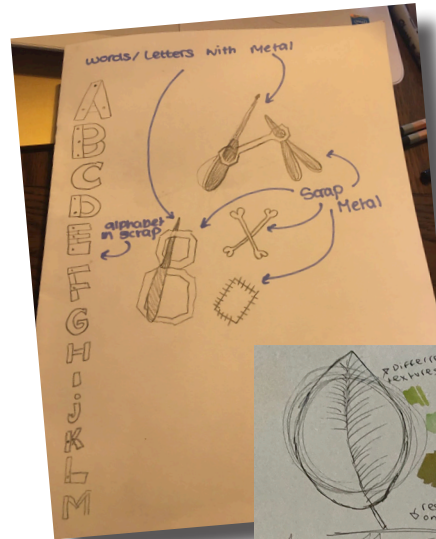
A local charity

Easter Egg Hunt

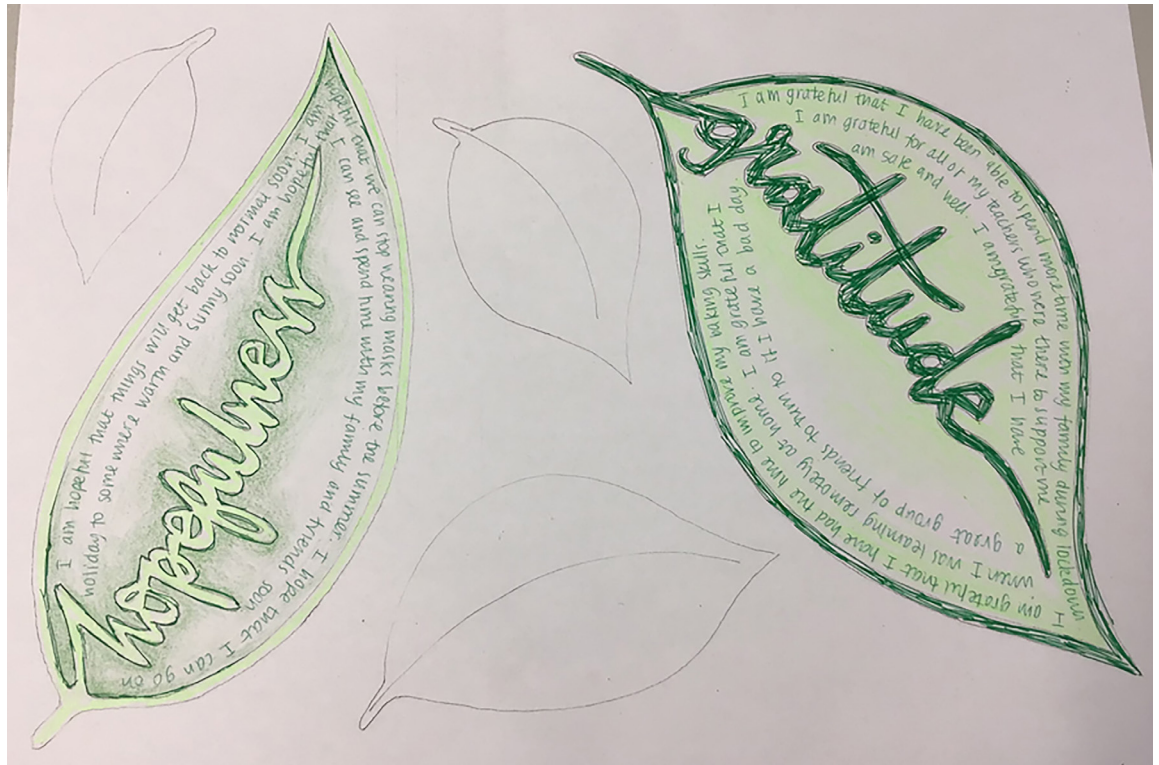
When: From 29th March- 3rd April
