

Local Uniform Procedures Wolfreton School and Sixth Form College

Trousers - Trousers must be smart, tailored, plain black, formal uniform type with a waistband, button and zip (worn with black socks). Pull-on, flared leggings, Lycra, jean, cotton, or cord type material are not acceptable. Trousers must be of a length to sit in or around the shoe (no cropped/capri trousers).
Blazers - Blazers must be worn when walking around the school site and in classrooms. Permission should be sought from the classroom teacher to remove blazers within lessons. During the summer, students are still expected to bring their blazers to the school, however a sensible decision will be taken each day and when too hot, a clear message will be projected on screens in the Forum inviting students to remove blazers should they wish.
House Tie – The Wolfreton House tie, must be worn with the top button of shirt / blouse fastened. 7-8 full stripes are to be showing at all times. Please confirm house colour before purchase.
Shorts – In the summer term (only), students have the option to wear black shorts instead of trousers or a skirt. These shorts should be smart, classic and formal (school trouser heavy fabric) and not cargo, Lycra or sports. Short shorts are not permitted.
Jewellery - Students are advised not to bring any jewellery to school. Additional jewellery will be confiscated, and consequences will be issued in line with the Behaviour Policy. Students who bring any items on-site must be aware that the school accepts no responsibility for any jewellery that is lost or stolen.
Coats - Coats are likely to be required for inclement weather. Coats decorated with inappropriate phrases / text are not permitted. Coats must not be worn in the school building. Hooded tops should not be worn as an alternative to a coat. Sweatshirts / hooded tops must not be worn under blazers.
Hats – Hats, scarves and gloves may be worn in cold weather. In such weather they may be worn outside but must not be worn anywhere in the school building (except for religious observance or medical need).
Belts – Large decorative belts are not permitted. If a belt is required, this must be thin and black.
School Bag - Students are expected to bring a suitable school bag each day, large enough to carry their books / files.
Pin Badges – School issued pin badges e.g. attendance recognition or student council badges may be worn on the lapel of the blazer. Non-school issued badges should not be worn.
Lost Property - All school uniform and PE kit should be clearly labelled with the student's name to enable it to be identified in lost property if lost. Any lost property is transferred to the Main Office, where it is held for a period of no longer than 6 weeks then donated.
Modifications to the uniform policy for religious or cultural reasons - Any requests to modify the school uniform for religious reasons or cultural reasons must be made in writing to the Headteacher before admittance.
Maintaining standards - Students who choose not to follow the school uniform and smart-business like expectations can expect to be addressed through the Behaviour Policy. Students will receive a first 'Warning' and will be invited to rectify any issue that can be resolved immediately. This includes removing any item deemed inappropriate by the school. Where an aspect cannot be resolved, a student can expect to be placed in Internal Exclusion until such time that the issue can be resolved.
