Personal Statements

J-M Chatwin

Hello, my name is J-M Chatwin.

I work full time as an Office Manager for a local firm of solicitors, I am mum to Jessica who is 13 and is in Year 8 at Wolfreton, and I also have a 10 year old daughter, Paige, whom I hope will attend from September 2020.

I became a parent governor at my daughter's primary school in September 2010, progressing to Chair of Governors of that governing body in October 2014. Due to a move to the East Riding of Yorkshire early in 2018 and other personal circumstances, I took the decision to resign in July 2018 - I felt, ultimately, that I could not fulfil the role to the benefit of the school at that time.

I have been a single parent since late 2015, and believe my work history, my qualifications (I am educated to degree level - LLB Law with Criminology), alongside numerous governor related training courses during my tenure as a governor with Hull City Council give me a unique insight into the workings of the school environment, and I am keen to expand my knowledge into the secondary school education sector.

I am an open, honest person who has the best interests of your children (and mine) at heart, and believe that these experiences give me qualifications (financial, leadership etc), to be confident that I can contribute effectively to the Local Governing Board at Wolfreton should I be successful in my application.

My daughter attends the school in Year 7. Wolfreton was her first choice to continue into her secondary education. I also have a son who attends a Wolfreton feeder school. I attended Wolfreton and completed my GCSE's and 'A' levels at the school. It's great to see how the school has changed since I was a pupil.
