What are you most proud of?





Transport

We offer free transport to our sixth form students:

- Service C1 and C2 provide transport between Cottingham, Hessle and Wolreton campuses and additional routes in the local area including West Hull, Dunswell, Willerby and Anlaby/Kirkella.
- Cottingham campus service buses run from Dunswell and Little Weighton to campus.

- Hessle campus service buses cover Anlaby Road, Boothferry Road, Hessle Road and surrounding areas.
- Holderness campus service buses run across the catchment area and through Hull.
