Pastoral Care

Here at Wolfreton, we prioritise pastoral care.

We have an enviable team both in experience and scale and all are committed to ensuring that our students feel safe, supported and also enjoy a sense of fun that working as a team brings.

We work hard to ensure that each individual is known and matters. This begins with the Form Tutor. Wherever possible, our Form Tutors stay with their tutor group from Year 7 through to Year 11; tutors do change in the Sixth Form. All students also benefit from a Pastoral Manager and a Head of Year who work with each year. Our Year 7 team always focus on Year 7, with our other teams

picking up their year group in Year 8 and then following them through the school.

All students join one of our five school Houses: Nightingale, Owen, Rowntree, Tomlinson and Wilberforce. Each House has a House Leader who will lead their House to develop our 5 C's: Competition, Collaboration, Community, Charity and Championing Success.

Our wider pastoral team includes our Safeguarding and Attendance Teams and our Trust Mental Health Team, along with Marlowe, our Trust well-being dog who is always welcomed with an abundance of smiles. Together, our pastoral teams celebrate the best in our students, and endeavour to provide appropriate care in times of needs.

Curriculum

At Wolfreton we work hard to engage and motivate all students in a challenging whilst supportive learning environment.

Our subject specialist teachers have designed a knowledge rich curriculum that has carefully identified the subject knowledge that students should know and be able to apply at key points in their learning journey. This curriculum has been carefully sequenced and opportunities to revisit knowledge and skills built in, to ensure prior learning forms the bedrock for future learning. Our approach supports the notion of a 'Big Picture' meaning that whilst studied separately, links between subjects and to the real world are developed.

At Wolfreton we value all subject disciplines. Our approach ensures dedicated time is available for all National Curriculum subjects, avoiding rotations. In the classroom, lessons are shaped around 'Big Questions'. We use research to teach in ways that impact and a combination of low stakes quizzing, and more formal assessment supports students to retain the knowledge they learn. Ultimately, through our subject specialists and approaches we achieve success and inspire further learning.

Key Stage 3

At Wolfreton we teach Key Stage 3 across Years 7, 8 and 9.

Our curriculum is based on the National Curriculum so all students study English, mathematics, science, geography, history, a language (French or Spanish from Year 7, with the option to pick up Japanese in Year 9), as well as physical education, religious studies, computing, art, music and PSHE (Personal Social and Health Education). All students also study drama as a discrete subject as we believe in the confidence and skills this develops.

Key Stage 4

Through our guided choices approach, our Key Stage 4 curriculum is organised to enable students to follow more individual learning programme that meet their needs and aspirations.

All students continue studying English (Language and Literature), mathematics, science (the separate sciences of biology, chemistry and physics, or combined science), geography or history (students can choose to study both) and, where appropriate, a language (French, Spanish or Japanese). In addition, all students continue to study computing, religious studies, PSHE and physical education. Students are then able to select subjects from a comprehensive range of options, enabling them to develop their interests, skills and abilities, whilst also meeting their needs.



Learning Support

As a school, we treat all students equally and we are committed to providing the best possible support and learning opportunities.

We work hard to identify the needs of students with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities and to ensure they learn well and enjoy school. All of our teachers share responsibility for our SEND students however, in addition, our Learning Support Team work with families to identify where additional provision is required.

Information, advice and guidance, and support

Young people today have to make more decisions about their lifestyle, education and future career than any previous generation.

The Quality in Careers Standard Award recognises our commitment to providing high quality information, advice and guidance. Support can be accessed through both the Careers Leader and Careers Adviser, as well as our additional mentors and the school nurse.



Enrichment with Character

Wolfreton achieves outstanding success in sport and has a long standing sporting tradition.

We aim to develop individual interests and enthusiasm for sport and emphasise the importance of co-operation and teamwork as well as the desire for excellence.

Students at Wolfreton are able to participate in a wide range of extracurricular activities. These provide opportunities both for those who have existing interests and for those who feel like trying something new. Highlights have included Rock Challenge, choir and orchestra,

whole school productions, Streetdance shows, History Debating and Japanese clubs. Students also have the opportunity to take on a leadership role as a House Council Rep or as a Peer Mentor, where they are trained to support others by providing friendship and activities at lunchtime sessions.

As a school, we believe that educational visits can enhance learning and development in many ways. Students have visited the WW1 memorials and Auschwitz with History, Hull Truck and the Yorkshire Playhouse with Drama, taken part in funded work experience in France and Spain and enjoyed the annual ski trip to Italy's Aosta Valley, always a popular choice

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Positive Destinations

As well as links with Oxbridge and other top universities, we offer degree specific support for students applying for courses such as medicine and teaching.

Careers advice is provided to ensure students are aware of the breadth of opportunities available to them. Each year our sixth form students leave us to go on to a variety of positive destinations including both university and apprenticeships with the majority of our students progressing on to a place at their first choice university.
