Year 12/13	<p>Ongoing throughout the year:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Face to Face Career Appointments All students will have the opportunity to have at least one career appointment during Year 12 or 13. • All Y13 students complete a one-hour weekly session with a tutor. The year begins with a focus on UCAS to ensure all of the students who wish to apply for university have the opportunity to discuss with their UCAS tutor their course and university preferences. Tutors support the students in considering which institutions to apply for and assist them in writing their personal statements. For those students who have no intention of going to university they are able to use UNIFROG to look at apprenticeship opportunities and identify the requirements and skill sets required to move into their area of interest. They update and refine their CV and draft letters of application, so they are prepared to be able to apply when the apprenticeships become available throughout the year. • All Y12 students complete a one-hour weekly session with a tutor. Throughout the year there are sessions based on future destinations whether that be university, an apprenticeship or employment. • Y13 students are offered mock interviews both for their university as well as apprenticeship/employment applications. These interviews are carried out by both teaching staff, support staff as well as former A Level students who have gone onto university, including Oxbridge undergraduates. • The Wolfreton alumni is used successfully to support students applying for university particularly for prospective medics, vets and Oxbridge applicants with mock interviews and preparing for university interviews. Students taking BTEC Health, and Social Care participate in a work based placement in areas related to the care industry. • Students meet with ex-Consortium 6th Form alumni related to Future Medics, Future Lawyers and Future Teachers. <p>Autumn Term</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Y12 students complete Pathways Day 1 in which they are asked to consider their future plans at the start of their Level 3 studies. This information is then shared with their form tutors to enable discussions throughout the year about students' plans post-18. • All Y13 students participated in Pathways Day 2, in October, involving: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ a series of different talks from local companies/providers including Swift, Rollits, Goldie Smailes, BAE, HETA, Humberside Police, East Riding Social Care, NHS, Siemens, etc. These employers provided talks looking at routes into their businesses as well as the opportunities provided by them. ○ students also participated in a session looking at the Labour Market Information nationally, regionally and locally. There was an overview of the growth areas for employment as well as looking at the Hull and East Yorkshire Skills Dashboard. ○ students gained an insight into effective interview skills. • Y12 students are introduced to Unifrog in half term 2 in which they can look at universities and courses as well as apprenticeships. • Students meet with ex-Consortium 6th Form alumni related to Future Medics, Future Lawyers and Future Teachers. <p>Summer term</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All Y12 students are encouraged to attend the annual UCAS Higher Education Convention held at Leeds Beckett University. The exhibition helps our students to explore a wide range of academic and career opportunities and discover a future that's right for them.
